2017 CA Legislature: *Voting Records*



The California Police Chiefs Association represents over 330 active municipal police chiefs whose primary mission is to provide safety for more than 26 million Californians. In furtherance of that mission, CPCA takes an extremely active role in the legislative process, specifically regarding policy with public safety implications. Due to the continuous efforts to reform our criminal justice system and the recent and alarming rise in violent crime, CPCA has decided to keep a record of the priority public safety legislation debated every year, and the vote record of the California Legislature. The following is a brief summary of the issues we raised for the top CPCA bills of 2017, and the subsequent voting record:

RED BILLS: CPCA Oppose

GREEN BILLS: CPCA Support

AB 42/SB 10 (Bonta/Hertzberg): Identical bills that would have established a pretrial release system reliant partially on risk-assessment. CPCA opposed due to concerns that the system would have let dangerous individuals be released pretrial.

AB 90 (Weber): When this bill first came up in the Assembly, it would have effectively shut down the CalGang database for up to 2 years, and restricted our ability to share information with federal partners.

AB 186 (Eggman): Would have allowed select counties to operate “safe injection site” programs. CPCA opposed because it would enable drug use without mandating treatment, and other practical concerns.

AB 1308 (Stone): Extended youth offender parole from 23 to 25 years old. CPCA opposed because individuals over 23 should not be given a fundamentally lenient parole opportunity because of their age.

AB 1408 (Calderon): Added factors and protections for parole consideration. CPCA supported this bill.

AB 1448 (Weber): Would allow parole for any individual over 60 who has served 25 years incarceration.

AB 1578 (Jones-Sawyer): Would have limited sharing of information with federal law enforcement partners regarding marijuana operations in the state. CPCA opposed because of the restrictions and limitations on partnerships geared to preventing drug trafficking.

SB 21 (Hill): Would have set significant hurdles regarding the acquisition and utilization of surveillance technology, which would have been cost prohibitive and potentially compromise police tactics.

SB 54 (de Leon): Although CPCA did eventually go neutral on this bill, at the time it first passed the Senate, it greatly restricted ICE interaction with local law enforcement during criminal investigations.

SB 65 (Hill): Clarified that individuals cannot smoke or ingest marijuana while driving or riding in a vehicle. CPCA supported this bill.

SB 180 (Mitchell): Removed the 3-year optional penalty enhancement on *repeat* drug dealers. CPCA opposed this measure because these are repeat offenders, and the enhancement was optional.

SB 395 (Lara): Would require that all those 15 years of age or younger would have to consult with an attorney before waiving their Miranda rights. CPCA opposed because there are existing protections for juveniles and this new hurdle would have been unduly restrictive during critical points of investigations.

SB 620 (Bradford): Would make mandatory gun enhancements optional, at judicial discretion. CPCA is committed to preventing gun violence and opposed this measure because it signals these crimes may not be as serious.

DATES for VOTES of RECORD

Most of the votes recorded reflect bills in their final state. However, several bills listed were amended significantly enough through the legislative process that CPCA removed opposition (AB 90 and SB 54). Additionally, several bills did not make it far enough to be voted on by the second house (AB 1578 and SB 21). As such, the votes recorded were only at a time the bill was among CPCA priorities to oppose, or support. Below is a list of the date each vote was recorded, as well as whether the bill passed or failed:

AB 42 – Assembly ONLY (6-1-17)

- Failed passage on Assembly Floor (35 AYES, 37 NOES, 8 ABS)

AB 90 – Assembly ONLY (6-1-17)

- Passed Assembly (42 AYES, 36 NOES, 2 ABS); Amended in Senate

AB 186 – Assembly (6-1-17); Senate (9-12-17)

- Passed Assembly (41 AYES, 33 NOES, 6 ABS); Failed in Senate (19 AYES, 17 NOES, 4 ABS)

AB1308 – Assembly (6-1-17); Senate (9-12-17)

- Passed Assembly (41 AYES, 36 NOES, 3 ABS); Passed Senate (23 AYES, 14 NOES, 3 ABS)

AB 1408 – Assembly (9-13-17); Senate (9-12-17)

- Passed Assembly (78 AYES, 0 NOES, 1 ABS); Passed Senate (39 AYES, 0 NOES, 1 ABS)

AB 1448 – Assembly (9-13-17); Senate (9-11-17)

- Passed Assembly (45 AYES, 31 NOES, 3 ABS); Passed Senate (21 AYES, 13 NOES, 6 ABS)

AB 1578 – Assembly ONLY (6-1-17)

- Passed Assembly (41 AYES, 33 NOES, 6 ABS); Not heard in Senate

SB 10 – Senate ONLY (5-31-17)

- Passed Senate (26 AYES, 11 NOES, 3 ABS); Not heard in Assembly

SB 21 – Senate ONLY (5-31-17)

- Passed Senate (21 AYES, 15 NOES, 4 ABS); Not heard in Assembly

SB 54 – Senate ONLY (4-3-17)

- Passed Senate (27 AYES, 12 NOES, 1 ABS); Amended in Assembly

SB 65 – Assembly (8-24-17); Senate (5-30-17)

- Passed Assembly (76 AYES, 0 NOES, 3 ABS); Passed Senate (Unanimous)

SB 180 – Assembly (9-12-17); Senate (5-15-17)

- Passed Assembly (41 AYES, 33 NOES, 5 ABS); Passed Senate (22 AYES, 13 NOES, 5 ABS)

SB 395 – Assembly (9-14-17); Senate (9-15-17)

- Passed Assembly (46 AYES, 48 NOES, 5 ABS); Passed Senate (29 AYES, 9 NOES, 5 ABS)

SB 620 – Assembly (9-12-17); Senate (9-13-17)

- Passed Assembly (42 AYES, 33 NOES, 4 ABS); Passed Senate (22 AYES, 13 NOES, 5 ABS)
