The standout models are Glendale and Concord. Both were able to go through their city councils to provide a job center in town and then enact ordinances to keep the day laborers from soliciting for work anywhere but at the job center. However, many other cities reported that those ordinances are being challenged on a constitutional (probably free speech) basis. So, it is a wait-and-see as far as whether or not they will withstand a court challenge.
