Burlingame	Sgt. Dean Williams	No, but will have one soon	Traffic enforcement, and all traffic related collisions/investigations (incl. property damage only)
Claremont	Chief Paul Cooper	Yes, 1 sergeant and 4 officers	They only handle serious and death involved collisions
Daly City	Timothy Birch, Management Analyst	Yes	Traffic Safety Enforcement is an obligation of every member of the Daly City Police Department – not just the Traffic Unit. It is important for all personnel – especially sworn personnel – to remember, “Traffic enforcement is law enforcement.”
Downey		One sergeant supervising the unit, one traffic Detective, eight motor officers and two accident investigators (night time trafficenforcment in police vehicles)	Responsible for traffic enforcement, investigating traffic collisions and completing collision reports, as well as assisting the traffic Detective with follow-up.

Regan	Yes, 5 sworn and 3 non-sworn	<p>Traffic and Parking Enforcement, Investigation of certain collisions (fatals, City vehicle, etc) They do not investigate collisions on a routine basis. Conduct special enforcement (DUI, License, Seat belt check points, Commercial enforcement, child safety seat etc)</p> <p>Organize and supervise large parades; Home coming, Martin Luther King Jr. etc</p> <p>The Traffic Sgt is responsible for review of all collisions and DUI reports. The Sgt is also responsible for maintaining the vehicles assigned to the traffic unit.</p>
El Segundo	Chief David Cummings	Yes	<p>The Traffic Division is responsible for Traffic Accident Investigation, Traffic Enforcement, Traffic Control, and Parking Enforcement.</p>
Fairfield	Sergeant Mark Schrear	Yes	<p>Traffic collision and reporting is a traffic responsibility. However, patrol officers shall be utilized to investigate traffic collisions, whenever traffic officers are not available.</p>

Foster City	Captain Jon Froomin	Foster City Code establishes the existence of a Traffic Bureau within the Police Department and the duties and responsibilities of the Traffic Bureau and its personnel.	Personnel assigned to the Traffic Bureau shall carry out their respective duties and responsibilities so as to ensure proper investigation or reporting of all motor vehicle traffic accidents and shall actively participate in selective traffic enforcement with the goal of reducing traffic accidents and ensuring the safe and orderly movement of persons and property upon the streets and highways of Foster City.
Fremont	Lieutenant Tom Mikkelsen	Yes	Traffic Officers, at the discretion of the Watch Commander, may be assigned to the following investigations: A). Non-injury collisions, involving emergency vehicles (as defined by the California Vehicle Code), which are operating as emergency vehicles (except as provided in Section G above). B). Injury collisions which involve emergency vehicles (as defined by the California Vehicle Code) which are operating as emergency vehicles and do not include a City vehicle. C). Non-injury collisions where there is a possibility of major City liability (except as provided in Section G above).

Hayward	Captain Darryl McAllister	Yes	All injury collisions; DUI collisions; Hit and Run collisions where there is suspect information; all collisions involving on-duty City of hayward employees
Hemit	Deputy Chief Tony Margis	Yes	Primary duty is traffic enforcement, but may handle calls for service determined by the watch Commander due to volume of calls. Traffic unit is responsible for all traffic collision
Inglewood PD	Chief Jacqueline Seabrooks	yes	Traffic enforcement officers are assigned in police cars and are primarily responsible for preliminary traffic collision investigations. The investigation of traffic collisions includes the preparation of traffic collision reports and preliminary field investigations. Their secondary duty is the enforcement of all laws and regulations pertaining to motor vehicles. They must ensure the orderly flow of traffic in the city. Their primary enforcement tool is the issuance of traffic citations, although they also make arrests for traffic related offenses and impound unsafe motor vehicles. Traffic enforcement officers are available to support and assist the Patrol responses to traditional calls for service.
Pacifica	Captain Jim Tasa	Ad-hoc traffic unit	The primary duties of the motor unit are to enforce vehicle code violations, which contribute to, or are the primary collision factor for accidents. They are also responsible for handling all major injury accidents..

Pleasanton	Sgt. Michael J. Collins	One lieutenant, one sergeant and seven officers.	Primary responsibility is to provide for the safety of the motoring public. Traffic unit handles the majority of our department's collision
Pomona	Officer Eric Hamilton	One Sergeant and 12 officers	Enforcing the Vehicle Code, respond to traffic complaints from citizens in the community, investigate all hit and run collision reports (misdemeanor and felony) that are unsolved.

Roseville	Captain Stan Lumsden	The traffic enforcement unit consists of a Lieutenant, sergeant, motor officers, DUI officers, traffic CSOs and parking enforcement officers. The traffic enforcement unit is in the services division.	The goal of the Traffic Unit is the smooth and safe movement of traffic in the City. Engineering, enforcement, and education of the public and the investigation of traffic collisions may accomplish this goal. Enforcing the laws of the California Vehicle Code, traffic ordinances of the Roseville Municipal Code, and investigating injury collisions other than complaint of pain injuries.
South Pasadena	Chief Dan Watson	Yes, two motor officers. They are not part of the patrol deployment, but they attend briefing.	They stay current on traffic collision data and the streets with the most complaints. They have no problem knowing where the problem is.
